Rathbun Center Plans for the Future

The Rathbun Center Board of Directors met recently to develop a strategic plan to guide the Center for the next 5 to 10 years. With a current budget of almost \$500,000 and a building 12 years old, the importance of planning for the future is paramount to the continuing success of the Center. The main areas of focus were funding development, maintenance and refurbishing of the Center, and expansion.

As the cost of doing business increases about 10% a year and the capital expenses anticipated for repairs and replacement are on the rise, the development of expanded funding sources will be a major objective for the Board of Directors. As our architect, Bill Ashe, informed us, "Expect everything that is here to break and need replacement in the next 10 years." With a 27,000 sq. ft. building, that is a daunting prediction. A major task will be to develop a plan for fundraising that will meet the demands of these capital expenditures.

In addition to funding concerns, the Board also began addressing the issue of the increasing need for additional guest rooms. A task force has been established to look at all the options and consequences of expansion. By renovating the space

downstairs, in partnership with Mission Hospitals, we have already been able to add 7 guest rooms to our original 25 rooms.

The Rathbun Center operates with 4 full time and 2 part time staff. When you consider that we are open every day of the year 24/7, that is an amazing statistic. We could not do this without our 100 hard-working volunteers. They are at the Center every day from 9:00a.m. until 9:00p.m., working 3-hour shifts. They give

assistance and comfort to our guests and try to brighten everyone's day. As the Board of Directors completed their day of planning, they paused to remember our loyal volunteers and how important they are to the success of the Rathbun Center. We take a moment to thank the Rathbun Center Board of Directors because, after all...they are volunteers, too.

Strategic Planning Survey Helps Shape the Next Decade

It's been eleven years since we welcomed our first guest! It seemed timely to engage in strategic planning to help us shape our next decade of service. Surveys were sent to volunteers, staff, board members, selected donors, some past guests, community leaders and the medical community (a cross section of people who have a connection with the Center). With an impressive 39% response, we were delighted to learn that the Rathbun Center has a wonderful reputation throughout WNC. The general consensus is that more exposure is needed in order to generate funding.

Maintaining and increasing our donor base, including major donors, is one of the most important factors facing the Center's future. Many of our survey participants agreed that the increasing demand for our services will require thoughtful planning.

We really appreciate the careful thought behind each survey. The results showed that our volunteers love working at the Center and feel much appreciated. The staff received high marks from all groups surveyed. There were so many great ideas that warranted further consideration, we will be forwarding this information to the appropriate Board committees.

You Can Make a Difference

Making a gift to charity, such as the Lewis Rathbun Center, as part of your estate plan is a beautiful way to leave a *living legacy*. There are a number of alternatives offered that present significant tax advantages to you and your family.

Leaving a gift to a charity in *your Will* is the easiest and generally the least expensive way to leave a *charitable legacy*. A gift through your Will can be a specific dollar amount or a fractional percentage of your total estate. Any gifts under your Will to qualified charities, such as the Rathbun Center, are deductible from your estate for estate tax purposes.

Setting up a *charitable remainder trust* can be an excellent way to leave a legacy gift to a charity and turn highly appreciated assets into a lifetime income stream that will eliminate immediate capital gains tax on the sale of appreciated assets, reduce or eliminate estate taxes, reduce current income taxes, and increase your income. Upon your death, the remaining assets pass to the trust beneficiary, which must be a tax-exempt charitable institution such as the Rathbun Center.

IRAs and 401K's are other charitable options. If a person inherits an IRA or 401k they will be required to pay income tax on the distributions from those plans. However, if the IRA or 401k is left to a charity, generally charities are exempt from income tax and will receive distributions from the plan tax-free.

These are just a few ways that you can leave a legacy through the Lewis Rathbun Center as part of your estate plan. It is important to remember that a charitable estate planning legacy can be a wonderful gift to the charity and beneficial to you and your heirs.

If you are interested in making a charitable legacy a part of your estate plan, it is important that you consult competent legal counsel to assist you in developing a plan that fits your particular needs.
